INTRODUCTION

This detailed ACTION PLAN completes the final element of the Parish Plan which was initiated by the Parish Council in 2003. This Action Plan was adopted by the Parish Council at their meeting on 4 September 2006.

Both for ease of reference and simplicity it is divided into three main sections. They are as follows:-

A. The Environment This includes Actions A1 to A18 and is highlighted in GREEN

B. Education, Work & Retirement This includes Actions B1 to B10 and is highlighted in BLUE

C. Quality of Life

This includes Actions C1 to C14 and is highlighted in RED

Each section is divided into three columns; with column one showing details of the proposed Action, column two listing those responsible for taking specific action, and column three giving an indication of the time-frame during which the Action should occur.

It is expected that the Action Plan will be amended over time as new priorities emerge. It should therefore be regarded as a framework for the future which can be updated continually.

The implementation of the Action Plan will be monitored by the Steering Group who will report to the Parish Council on a regular basis.

SHORT These items should be actioned and in place during the years 2006-2008

MEDIUM These items should be actioned and in place during the years 2008-2010

LONG These items should be actioned and in place during the years 2010-2012


ON-GOING These items are current practice and should be continued
