The Minutes of Bredon Parish Council Meeting held at Bredon Village Hall on Monday 12th July 2010 at 7.15pm.

1. Apologies For Absence.

Apologies were received and accepted from Cllr Wenham and Cllr Hardman (County and District).

2. Declaration Of Interests.

Councillors were reminded of the need to update their register of interest.

Cllr Handy declared a Prejudicial Interest in item 7h and abstained from the discussion.

3. To Consider The Adoption Of The Minutes Of The Meeting Held On The 7th June 2010.

The minutes were approved and signed as a true record.

Temporary Closure order had been received for Back Lane, whilst Electrical work is being carried out. The council agreed not to sign the Parish Paths Agreement as there would be no allocation of funds this year.

The council agreed for a tree and bench to be placed on the playing field in memory of a young resident. The new Government is committed to the abolition of Regional Strategies returning the decision making powers on housing and planning to local councils.

The council will be co opting two Councillors at the meeting to be held in September, the vacancies will be advertised in the parish.

11. To Discuss the Damage to Morton's Bank by Rugby Balls.

The Rugby Club has assured the Parish Council that this matter is in hand and that a net will be erected to stop further damage to Morton's Bank.

12. To Discuss WCC Winter Services 2010/2011.

The Council agreed the following.

 - The incline at Westmancote, the whole of Bredons Norton, Moreton Bank, Kinsham to Kemerton Lane. Junction of Cheltenham Road and Kemerton Road outside Doctors surgery. Junction Of Oak Lane and Main Road. Dock Lane incline.
- Location of Current Grit Bins.
 - 3 x Westmancote Hill, 3 x Dock Lane, 1 x Eckington Road, 1 x St Giles Road, 1x Bredons Norton.
- Requested Grit Bins.
 - Bredons Norton Junction of the road to Bredons Norton and the main road to Eckington (Reference SO927383) and Westmancote, Half way up the steep populated part of Upper Westmancote (Reference SO942379). Near Home Farm, Bredons Norton.
- The parish would be able to monitor the grit bins.
- Keys Areas to be Snow ploughed.
