Cllr Gillespie had received contact from a Mr Hood who lives at 51 Beaumont Lawns. He has raised concerns over some tall trees that are planted the other side of his back garden. One of which is an oak tree that is over 50 ft tall, covered in ivy and seems to be unsteady. Cottons who are the estate agents for the landowners of the land where the trees are situated have visited the site and have cut down

other trees on this land but have stated that they cannot do anything about these trees as they are on private land. It was advised that Mr Hood contacts his insurance company to explain the situation and write to Cottons to highlight his concerns. There is nothing that PC can do to help but Mr Hood will update Cllr Gillespie on the on-going situation.
