## 1. Apologies for absence

# 3. To adopt the Minutes of the previous meeting

The Minutes of the meeting held on Thursday 9<sup>th</sup> July 2009 were accepted as a true record of that meeting and were signed as such by the Chairman of the meeting.

# 5. Report from Police Beat Manager

CSO Hide reported that there had been an increase in burglaries – from homes and garages - and she urged greater vigilance by all.

One councillor informed the meeting that his cat had been shot some months previously and he had reported the matter to the police who said that they took the incident seriously. He questioned CSO Hide as to why the matter had not been followed up. She agreed to investigate and reply directly to him.

CSO Hide emphasised that the Police welcomed information from the public. If the matter is urgent, dial 999. If it is not urgent, dial 0300 333 3000.

## **6. Reports from District and County Councillors**

County Councillor Tom Wells informed the meeting that he had been asked to advise about the speed limit to apply on the A438 at Long Green. Suggestions had been made that the number of accidents indicated a lower limit but that the sparsity of housing suggested a continuation of the same limit. He asked for the advice of the Council. Because no Councillor

lives in the vicinity, the Chairman invited Mrs Bloxham, who lives locally to Long Green, to express her views. She thought that although a lower limit would be welcome the additional signage – especially if not vigorously enforced, as was likely to be the case - would not.

# 7. Public Comment

Miss Eleanor Challenor asked whether the Council had considered creating a Community Land Trust in order to construct affordable housing within the Parish. The Chairman responded that, although that particular mechanism had not been reviewed, a very careful study had been made of the possible provision of affordable housing; after much deliberation it had been decided discontinue the project because of concerns about control, the charges that would be levied to beneficiaries and, associated therewith, the existence within the Parish of sufficient demand.

Miss Challenor then suggested that there was more that the Council could do to bring matters of interest to the attention of parishioners. She had in mind news of local activities and events, and useful contacts in case of an emergency. The Chairman readily agreed that there was more that could be done but emphasised that to do anything volunteers were needed and these were in short supply. He accepted that the topic could usefully be developed and invited Miss Challoner to put her views to the Clerk after the meeting.

## 8. Rôle

During a short discussion, County Councillor Tom Wells opined that it was not the role of the Council to act as a policeman in the Parish – for example by reporting infractions of the planning laws – but that if allegations of malfeasance were made to the Parish Council it was right and proper that the Council refer these to the competent authorities. This view was accepted *nem con*.

### 9. CAPRI

Mr Joseph Gabbott, Secretary of CAPRI, informed the meeting that National Grid had modified their application, principally by proposing additional bunding and planting, entirely with deciduous species. CAPRI believed that these modifications did nothing to mitigate the impact of the application and, indeed, were likely to have the contrary effect. The proposed industrial installation next to Flat Farm would be an alien and intrusive development in a tranquil, rural setting; there was no possibility of it being assimilated into that setting and therefore CAPRI continued in its opposition to the application.

Following Mr Gabbott's presentation, the Council instructed the Clerk to re-affirm to Tewkesbury Borough Council their firm recommendation that panning permission be refused.
