The Russell Memorial, St Peter's Parish Church, Powick



On the left hand wall of the Lady Chapel in St Peter's church is the most beautiful monument dedicated to Mary Russell.

It was created by sculptor **Thomas Scheemakers (or Scheemaeckers)** *circa* 1787 and is regarded as one of his finest works. He was the last of the family of sculptors originally from Antwerp. Thomas ceased working as a monumental sculptor after 1792.

There are many interpretations of the memorial, one being that it portrays a representation of motherhood in mourning, reclining upon a sarcophagus. The front of the sarcophagus bears a carved relief of Mary giving music instruction to her daughter. The little girl's hand rests on the keyboard of a spinet with music propped on the music desk. Her mother holds a book in her lap as she instructs her daughter, her left hand resting on the child's shoulder. The medallion of mother and child is flanked by a variety of musical instruments.

According to Mary's husband William, and carved on the front, 'by a sincere, complacent, and affectionate temper Mary endeared the conjugal union; the maternal office she discharged with singular judgment, attention and delight. In cultivating those qualities, and excellent principles, paternal love, and guardian care, implanted, she formed a character most worthy, amiable, and pleasing. Her musical talents were various and extensive - taste, sweetness, expression, distinguished her song; execution and grace her instrumental harmony. But far more important was her exemplary regard to religious, moral, and social duties; piety and benevolence prevailed in her mind; cheerfulness and simplicity in her manners; in all her conduct the influence of virtue.'

BIRTH



Mary was born on 21st June 1758. She was the eldest daughter of London barrister Joseph Cocks and Margaret Thorniloe, both originally from Herefordshire and buried in Easton Bishop churchyard. Mary and her younger sister Margaret were very wealthy co-heiresses and their father ensured that his two daughters were well provided for in his will.

The portrait (left) shows young Mary, aged 6, with her aunt Margaret. This was painted by Sir Joshua Reynolds in 1789. It may have been the last commissioned portrait made by Sir Joshua before his blindness.

Mary posed for the miniature (right) the year before she married William. It was painted on ivory by John Smart.

Joseph Cocks appointed his sister and two brothers as trustees of his estate until his daughters were aged twenty one or married.

MARRIAGE

Mary was the first wife of wealthy barrister-at-law, William Russell of Powyke Court, Worcestershire. They married on 18th March 1782 in St Martin's church, Worcester.

Just one year to the day later, Mary gave birth to a daughter, whom the couple named after her mother. Unfortunately young Mary, like her mother and maternal grandfather before her, did not have a long life and was only 23 when she died.

DEATH

Mary died on the 27th November 1786, age only 28. She is buried inside the church and at the bottom of her memorial it says 'Fiat Voluntas Dei' - May God's Will be Done.

Mary's sister **Margaret** (nee Cocks, 1773-1847) was only 13 when Mary died. A painting (right) in the Victoria and Albert Museum depicts Margaret mourning at the urn of her sister.

Monuments by Thomas Scheemakers in the church of St John the Baptist at Eastnor

There is a memorial to **Edward Charles Cocks**, who drowned aged 14 in 1782 whilst at Westminster School. Made by Scheemakers, it has a pile of books at the foot, the square cap of a Westminster boy and a lamb.

In the church tower is a bust in memory of **Joseph Cocks**, who died in 1775 at the age of 42. It was made by Thomas Scheemakers after a design of James Stuart and is in brown and white marble with a sarcophagus with a profile in a roundel and putti above.

There is also a marble statue of a woman seated by an urn, set against drapery and with an inverted torch which is in in memory of **Mrs Mary Cocks** (1724-1779), again by Scheemakers.

Thomas Scheemakers (c. 1740 - 15 July 1808) - he signed himself Scheemaeckers, was a sculptor in late eighteenth-century London, the son of the sculptor Peter Scheemakers.

We also learned that the beautiful small cartwheel hats worn on the side of the head and favoured by many members of the royal family are called hatinators. We now know who to go to for that special occasion hat.

The search for an alternative venue proved to be very difficult – there are an amazing number of groups and organisations in Malvern all requiring rooms for an evening meeting. We were fortunate to secure the Green Room at the Cube in Albert Road North, Malvern.

The meetings will still be on the second Tuesday evening at 7.30.

REPORT FROM GUARLFORD VILLAGE HALL

March 2024

Refurbishment work commenced on the village hall at the start of January with the contract for works going to Paul and Mark Mucke, the same contractors who carried out the work on improvements to the toilets in 2023. This current phase of work is expected to be completed by September 2024.

The kitchen has been insulated and updated and is due for completion this week.

The **stairwell** has also been insulated and a new staircase has been delivered ready for fitting. Some insulation has been started in the **main hall** but the next phase of the project will be to repair the roof, entrance door and external brickwork. This external work has been programmed for May when it is hoped that the weather will have improved.



The village hall committee have organised two more community events for April and May, after which the main function room will be out of commission for most of the period until September 2024. The Peter Mayner room downstairs will still be accessible and it is hoped that this will be suitable for the Parish Council Annual Meeting and the Annual Parish Meeting in **May 2024.**


Work on the stairwell still has a way to go but it is now fully insulated.
