CSO John Tilt was attending the PACT meeting but had emailed his report:

24 October: Cobley Hill: Loose cow returned to field.

31 October: Hewell Cricket Club: Attempted burglary; offenders making off when disturbed.

No property had been stolen and enquiries were continuing.

HMP Hewell: Incidents include visitors behaving inappropriately, prisoners on day release

returning late, anti-social behaviour by visitors and prisoners.

All items received were tabled in a folder for Councillors' inspection at the meeting and were Noted.

7 PLANNING MATTERS:

a) Applications for Consideration:

09/0703 Sunny Bank Farm, Stoney Lane: Change of use of land and existing buildings from agricultural use to an outdoor activity centre, including quad biking, 'laser tag' and archery facilities. Creation of associated parking facilities for 49 vehicles and diversion of existing access road; creation of new vehicular access onto Stoney Lane; erection of four field shelters; stationing of temporary building for use as marshal's hut.

Resolved: to comment the Parish Council totally rejects this application for the following reasons:

Improper use of the green belt

Additional traffic on Stoney Lane and the surrounding roads.

Noise:

- the area is already noisy due to an existing clay shoot.
- there are many residential developments in the area which will be affected by noise even though they are several metres from the application site.

Agriculture - the Parish Council strongly object to good agricultural land being used as an outdoors activity centre.

The proposed use is environmentally unfriendly, as the quad biking and users accessing the site will create pollution.

Local residents have made strong representations to the Parish Council objecting to this proposal.

09/0843 The Design Centre, Tack Farm, Hewell Lane: Change of use from office to dwelling (split level apartment).

Resolved: to comment there were no objections to the application.

Members were all in favour of administering the Lengthsman Scheme on behalf of Burcot Village Hall subject to receiving an indemnity that Burcot would supervise and indemnify the Parish. Admin costs were covered in the scheme but a figure of 5% was discussed.

Hedges: Hewell Lane: Clerk to contact Highways regarding the parishioner's comments on hedge cutting on Hewell Lane near Benton's Cottage.

Hewell Lane speeding - parishioner to be advised that as the police do not support the 40mph limit the Parish Council's 'hands were tied'.

Wharf Lane: Cricket Club to be commended on their hedge cutting and asked to finish trimming the tree adjoining Hewell Lane.
