The Minutes of the meeting held on 10 March 2009 were approved. Proposed: Cllr Ashwin Seconded: Cllr Orr-Cooper.

4 PROGRESS REPORTS FOR INFORMATION:

Clerk: The Clerk's report was noted.

The publication of Bromsgrove DC's draft Parish Charter was acknowledged.

Community Spaces Grant Scheme: to provide a bench on Dust House Lane and enhancement of area adjoining Alcester Road and Holyoakes Lane to be investigated by Cllr Orr-Cooper.

Chairman: The Chairman outlined the meeting he attended with Cllr Whittaker and the Clerk at Castiello Barn, Grange Lane on 8 April. The meeting had been convened by residents concerned by the increase in size and volume of traffic; speeding and associated safety of pedestrians; spate of recent accidents and erosion of verges adjoining properties.

The Parish Council offered to write to Worcestershire CC Highways to request an extension to the 40mph speed limit and ask our Lengthsman to remove branches obscuring any signs. Highways agreed to consider taking away the central white road line and paint white lines along the road edges; carrying out another road traffic survey; putting in verge marker posts outside Castiello Barn and the Old Granary; relocating warning signs; alternative routing for lorries via sat nav provider negotiations.

Members agreed that a letter would be sent to Highways regarding the speed limit.

5 POLICE REPORT:

CSO John Tilt attended.

7 April: Finstall Road: Cyclist fatality.

Grimley Lane reservoir: vehicle broken into and items stolen.

25 March: 4 Hewell Lane: BT engineer's ladder stolen from outside the property.

23 March: Stoney Lane: Border Fencing stolen safe.

21 March: Hewell Lane by Vigo bridge: five steel hurdles stolen.

20 March: Hewell Grange Prison: Asylum seeker refused to leave prison and had to be forcibly removed.

Few minor road traffic collisions along the lanes, no injuries sustained.

The Chairman thanked CSO Tilt for his report.

- 9 **LENGTHSMAN SCHEME:** All Members were in agreement to participate in the scheme for 2009/10; the annual budget of £2100 was noted.

Brockhill Lane: Lengthsman to be congratulated and thanked for their work in clearing out the ditch.

Alcester Road / Holyoakes: to be asked to spray brambles prior to enhancement works being carried out.

10 HIGHWAYS MATTERS:

Church Lane adoption: Following a request from Tardebigge School, the Council agreed to progress adoption to ensure future resurfacing of the road and pavement. Proposed: Cllr Denyer Seconded: Cllr Orr-Cooper All in agreement.

Clerk to contact CALC for advice on adoption procedures before progressing with Bromsgrove DC. CALC to be asked feasibility of unadopting a road.

Salt bins: Members to identify locations; Brockhill Lane put forward.

Brockhill Lane: opposite gates to the wood: flytipping to be reported to the Hub.

- 12 ENFORCEMENT: OLD WHARF, WHARF LANE: The report from The Enforcement Officer is to be circulated to Members.

- 14 CLERK'S SALARY: The 2008/09 National final salary award was confirmed. The interim award of 2.45% was approved by Members on 11 November 2008 leaving the additional 0.30% to be backdated to 1 April 2008. The clerk moved to SCP19 on 1 April 2008. The clerk's two additional increment points from 1 April 2009 one for the annual review and the second for the CiLCA qualification moving to SCP21 was confirmed.

DISTRICT COUNCILLOR'S REPORT: No report.

FOOTPATH WARDEN'S REPORT: Several stiles had been cleared. The apple tree planting on Alcester Road cost approximately £65, which was slightly over budget.

TREE WARDEN'S REPORT: Nothing significant to report.

COMMUNITY HALL REPORT: Cllr Denyer reported that the committee now met bi-monthly. The committee felt a sign was needed opposite Church Lane to advertise directions to the new car park. Members felt a proper signpost incorporating directions to the church, community hall and school car parks would be more beneficial and that proceeds from the barn dance could be used for this purpose.

A recent risk assessment of the car park highlighted problems for the disabled - walking sticks becoming stuck in the grasscrete; wheel chairs becoming stuck on the gravel; vertical markers were needed for the disabled.

A Trustee Gritting Indemnity and two grit bins to be positioned at the car park and hall entrances were requested.

The grant application for renewable energy had been stalled by the unexpected need to submit a planning application.
