Local Broadband requirements

Richard Levett at WorcsCALC forwarded information about community broadband; this includes the following –

"The current Government has committed that every household across all areas of the United Kingdom will receive a minimum broadband speed of 2Mbps by 2015. As well as the Government's commitment to improving broadband, private sector investment has been announced that will improve broadband connectivity in different areas. You may be lucky and find that investment is already being made to bring super-fast broadband to you.

Some communities have decided that rather than waiting for this to happen they need a good broadband service now. Several communities are developing broadband solutions for themselves and this may be an option for your community if there are no other plans for improving your broadband in the near future.

The aim of this Community Broadband guide is to help you to make the right decisions regarding Broadband provision and to decide whether some action is needed to bring improved broadband to your area."

The full document provides advice and information on how to access faster broadband speeds etc and is being sent to you by e-mail.

Consultation regarding the Parliamentary Constituency Boundary Review

Report from Sue Mould, Electoral Services Manager, BDC – received 13/09/2011

"As you may be aware the initial proposals for the 2013 Review of Parliamentary Constituencies were published today as the start of a **12 week consultation period to 5 December 2011** (a summary copy of the initial proposals and further details are available on the both council websites, Redditch BC and Bromsgrove DC).

A brief background note:

- To reduce the number of constituencies from 650 to 600 (502 in England)
- To be conducted on a European Region level the West Midlands region has 59 constituencies to be reduced to 54
- The new constituency size is to be between 72,810 and 80,473 using 1 December 2010 published electorate figures
- To use district/borough council wards (as at 6 May 2010) as building blocks
- Initial proposal invites written submissions of support or objection with a viable alternative proposal to:

- Four 2-day hearings to be held in the West Midlands area in November (list available on website)

Subsequent consultation will be undertaken where representations are received for revised proposals. The Boundary Commission has to complete the review and report to Parliament by 1 October 2013."

Extract from the Boundary Commission Parliamentary Constituency Review...

"34. In the south of Worcestershire, we propose an Evesham constituency which spans the width of Worcestershire in the south, extending to the border of the Borough of Redditch and extending to, but not including, the town of Great Malvern and the City of Worcester. This constituency includes 12 wards that are currently in the West Worcestershire constituency and most of the wards in the existing Mid Worcestershire constituency. It also includes the Inkberrow ward, which is in the existing Redditch constituency. The Worcester constituency is unchanged.

35. In the north of the county the Wyre Forest constituency remains unchanged. As a consequence of our changes elsewhere, we propose a new Bromsgrove and Droitwich constituency which extends further south than the existing Bromsgrove constituency to include the town of Droitwich.

36. The towns of Alvechurch and Hollywood are now included in our proposed Redditch constituency, having been transferred from the Bromsgrove constituency."
