Team changes:

Since our last newsletter, the Kempsey & Alfrick SNT have undergone some team changes. Unfortunately, we say goodbye to PC Hand who joins a different department in West Mercia Police. However, we welcome PC Smith and PCSO Emeny who join the team permanently. They join PC Stanley and PCSO Smith who remain on the team. As such, the team now have 2 Safer Neighbourhood Officers and 2 Police Community Support Officers.

Safer Schools:

Following feedback from a few parish councils surrounding parking, especially around schools. The Safer Neighbourhood Team have been visible outside various primary schools on the patch.

This provides opportunity to address road safety concerns, inappropriate parking and maintain visibility in the community. We continue to work with schools and partner agencies to help address concerns relating to road safety / parking.

Our action and patrols will continue throughout the year, and we share our patrols via our social media platforms such as Facebook and Neighbourhood Matters.

Rural crime:

The Kempsey & Alfrick SNT have maintained consistent rural patrols during both daytime and night-time hours, with a particular emphasis on addressing rural crime, burglaries and vehicle-related offences. Several parish councils highlighted fly-tipping as a concern. During our patrols, we did observe incidents of fly-tipping that had already occurred in certain areas and collaborated with Malvern Hills council to ensure these matters are effectively addressed.

Where incidents have occurred such as burglaries, the team have completed follow-up visits and undertaken enquiries to support ongoing investigations.

We continue to remind residents to remain vigilant and to report any suspicious activity to us via 101 or online www.westmercia.police.uk. *Always dial 999 in an emergency (or a crime in progress)*



Road safety:

Across the patch, we continue to see speeding and road safety as a continued priority that is raised to us (either through parish councils or residents).

Across the Malvern Hills area, Safer Neighbourhood Teams continue to act through speed enforcement or specific operations with an aim to improve road safety. This type of action has been taking place across the Kempsey & Alfrick patch, and we continue to work with partner agencies and the Road Safety teams to address road safety concerns.
