Mobile Phone Connectivity

In conjunction with Birtsmorton Parish and a telecommunication provider, Atlas, it is possible mobile phone signal may be improved for a part of Castlemorton in the vicinity of the school. A potential mast site in Birtsmorton is being explored and parish opinion is sought prior to a required planning application. The removal of the more powerful 3G signal is necessitating the requirement for more masts for mobile phones to receive 4G & 5G signal.
