GUARLFORD HISTORY GROUP AND VILLAGE WEBSITE



The Guarlford village website (guarlfordparish.uk) was set up twenty years ago and has been maintained since then by Angus McCulloch, who due to health issues now wishes to step down as webmaster.

Over the years, the website has been a useful 'one stop shop', bringing together links to all the village organisations, as well as maintaining its original purpose of storage for the GHG digital history archives. It has also been used by people tracing their family histories, requesting information and offering more memories. If anyone would like to consider taking on the role of webmaster, do please get in touch, and we can discuss the website, raising funding etc. (contact webmaster@guarlfordparish.uk) (If there are no offers of help, the website will disappear in August 2025, when the present hosting expires.)

The Guarlford History Group (GHG) was set up after the Millennium when the pond and churchyard

restoration schemes were awarded second prize in a Worcestershire community competition in 2002, and the parish council decided to use the money to research and write our village history. A group of local residents comprising Dr Eric Jones, Michael Skinner, Don Hill, Dr Peter Mayner, Janet Lomas and Rosemary and Angus McCulloch) met regularly to write *The Guarlford Story* (published 2005) and *The Guarlford Scene* (2008). We enjoyed gathering all the reminiscences of life in Guarlford decades ago, and memories that had been handed down through the generations, as well as capturing pictures of life at that time. It was fun organizing various community events and good to be able to set up the website for the village and fund many projects with the money raised by the sale of the two books – hope you enjoyed it too. But the few remaining members now feel that it is time to wind up this GHG.

If anyone would like to form a new Guarlford History Group, which could meet in the wonderfully regenerated village hall, there is equipment that can be used and the History archive cupboards, with documents, photographs, record books and other memorabilia. Again, do please get in touch and we can give advice about setting up a group.

Many thanks to all in the village who so generously provided material for our books and archive, and gave up their time for us to record their memories. (Perhaps we should all be writing down our own life stories to hand on to future generations?)

WI REPORT AUGUST 24

- 1) How many fire alarms do you have in your house?
- 2} Where are they situated?
- 3) When was the last time you checked them?

These were among the questions asked by members of the Fire Service who came to speak to us at our August meeting.

The ideal number for the family house is two, one upstairs and one downstairs and they should be checked every six months.

We are all familiar with the Fire Service attending building fires, traffic accidents, animal rescue and even adventurous small children with heads stuck in railings. Much of their time is also taken up with educating schools and the public in the best ways to help keep themselves and their families safe.

It is possible to book a free home visit to have alarms checked and, if necessary, replaced. Fire

safety advice is also available for people with sight, hearing or mobility difficulties.

Several of our members signed up for a home safety visit. An excellent service, well worth checking out.



Ladies Fighting Breast Cancer - members of Guarlford WI

For our last meeting in the Green Room we learned about the wonderful work undertaken by the charity, 'Ladies Fighting Breast Cancer'. They are a caring community of amazing women and men fighting and surviving breast cancer. The charity was established in 2000 by Veronica Kumeta and Sue Macmaster after their friend, Carol, died of the disease.

The LFBC offer support services on line and within the community, free of charge for anyone affected by a breast cancer diagnosis. There is a closed Facebook group run by trained volunteers who have experienced breast cancer themselves. They also offer online sessions

in small groups during the daytime, evening and 1-2-1 on request.

Coffee mornings and other events arranged across the county are posted on their Facebook page and the choir has proved to be very popular. Weekly practice sessions help to reduce stress and improve mood. The LFBC choir has a wide repertoire and sing at corporate charity events – they have even appeared on Britain's Got Talent!

First chemotherapy or radiotherapy sessions can be extremely daunting and the Hug-In-A-Bag initiative was created. A fabric bag filled with useful items eg water bottle, moisturiser, book, blanket nail varnish and many others. These were given free to anyone given a BC diagnosis

within a 70-mile radius of the QE hospital. Unfortunately, this may have to stop because of an overwhelming demand.

Members of the Craft group have made underarm breast cushions and knitted seamless hats and seat belt pads. New hat patterns were available.

It was good to hear a first- hand account of the effect that this disease can have, not only on the patient but also on the immediate family.

Ladies Fighting Breast Cancer is an amazing charity that believes that nobody should have to face breast cancer alone.

They are well worth any support we can give.




