Co-option of a Parish Councillor Application Form

<u>Eligibility</u>

Please confirm you are a British, Commonwealth, Republic of Ireland or European Union citizen and on the day of your nomination and subsequently the day of poll you are aged 18 or over. In addition, you must meet at least **one** of the following criteria (please answer "yes/no" accordingly):

1. on the relevant day and thereafter you continue to be on the electoral register for the parish, or

2. during the whole of the twelve months before that day you have owed or tenanted land or premises in the parish, or

YES/NO

3. during the whole of the twelve months before that day your principle or only place of work has been in the parish, or

YES/NO

4. During the whole of the twelve months before that day you have resided in the parish or within 4.8 kilometres of it.

Except for qualification (1), which must continue for the length of office, the above qualifications must apply for the period covering nomination and election.

Disqualification

Please note that the Elections Act 2022 has updated the disqualifications from being elected as a Local Councillor or being a member of a Local Council if he/she/they:

- (a) Holds any paid office or employment of the local council (other than the office of Chairman) or of a joint committee on which the council is represented; or
- (b) Is the subject of a bankruptcy restriction order or interim order.
- (c) Is the subject to the notification requirement of or under Part 2 of the Sexual Offences Act 2003, and the ordinary period allowed for making an appeal or application in respect of the order or notification has passed.
- (d) Has been sentenced to a term of imprisonment of three months or more (including a suspended sentence), without the option of a fine, during the five years before polling day and the ordinary period allowed for making an appeal or applications in respect of the conviction has passed.
- (e) Has been disqualified under the Representation of the People Act 1983 (which covers corrupt or illegal electoral practices).
- (f) Has been convicted of an intimidatory criminal offence motivated by hostility towards a candidate, future candidate or campaigner or holder of a relevant elective office.
- (g) Is otherwise disqualified under Part III of the representation of the People Act 1983 for corrupt or illegal practices.

For further information on the disqualification criteria view the Guidance for Candidates documentation at <u>www.electoralcommission.org.uk</u>. It is a criminal offence to make a false statement regarding your nomination as to your qualification for being elected, so if you are in any doubt you should contact your employer, consult the legislation or, if necessary, take your own independent legal advice. Bentley Pauncefoot Parish Council will not be able to confirm whether or not you are disqualified.
