September and Autumnal thoughts and activities seem to be on us rather soon but as usual there are many events and activities to keep us amused.



I well remembered more than forty years ago my Dad asking me to "give him, Mike Richardson and David Waring a hand" in installing a new organ in our Church. You will notice in the photograph it was extremely heavy and too wide for two men and the organ to fit through the Church door!

Keith Hearnshaw, the organist at Hanbury Church, and often playing for us at Bradley Green, had been offered a Wyvern Organ from a Church in Quinton, by Ms. Mela Witling, and as Hanbury already had a very good organ, Keith offered it to Bradley PCC. Adrian, lately having become Church Treasurer, was determined not to look a gift horse in the mouth and promptly set the wheels in motion for the move. Off we went in Adrian's van, Adrian, Keith and myself. There was a problem of "squeezing" the organ into the back of the van, but problem solved and back to Bradley Green with the "new" organ. All went surprisingly well and once set up in Bradley Church Keith was excited to play it and to reassure us that the organ would bring great joy to our little Church across the fields.

How right he was. The music filled the Church and we were all just astounded at the volume of pure sound.

The PCC will be making a donation to Ms. Mela Witling to her or her Church in Quinton. So that everyone can have the opportunity of listening to this fantastic instrument, an Organ Recital Concert is in the pipeline, so watch this space.



With just over 100 days to go before we set off on our Atlantic Row we are trying to get as much time on the water as possible. With that in mind we decided once again to row around the Isle of Wight at the end of July but became a little concerned on the lead up as high winds and waves were forecast. Yes, I appreciate we will

encounter those on our trip, but we decided not to take unnecessary risks at this stage unless we have to. Good decision! This was the weekend of the Fastnet Race where 80 yachts, starting off from Cowes and built for ocean sailing, retired, four were dismasted and one sank. A sobering reminder for us, and our families, that the sea is to be respected at all times and to minimise our risk where possible.

Most of our free time is now spent either attending courses, understanding how the equipment on the boat works, or trying to improve our fitness and stamina. I recently took part in an Olympic distance triathlon in London – a 1.5km swim, followed by a 40km bike ride and then a 10km run. It's a lot easier to write down on paper than 'do'! I managed to complete it in 2 hours 40 minutes and although weary it has made me realise that is the equivalent to just over one shift on the boat: the two of us will take shifts of two hours on and two hours off. And this won't just be for a one-off triathlon but rather continuous, night and day, for over forty days. Hmmm, not sure I had thought this through....

It is of course for a fabulous cause, Acorns Hospice, and it is only with the continued support of Corporate or personal donations that charities such as Acorns can survive. When I think of the struggle and heartache families with children with a life limiting or life threatening condition endure, I am sure you can empathise why Matt and I are prepared to push ourselves to the limit to raise as much money as possible. 

August, so far, has been warmer, though not without showers of rain both heavy and misty, so the fields are bright green with lush growth. The misty mornings are giving us an autumnal feel, reinforced by the hedgerows and trees taking on a dark green, and the berries taking on their autumn colours.

Having finished our hay making we are in a better position than those farmers still trying to harvest their grain crops. Unlike last year when the incredible warmth meant the crops' moisture content was almost too low, and driers lay idle, this year they will be in use!

We were pleased to welcome Tim back from a two-week break. Alice and Brendan having done a good job covering for him. The barn is still to be fully emptied of the straw bedding from last winter, a job that definitely needs finishing soon so that the piles can be left to compost down in the fields.

The cattle are looking glossy and very fine with their smooth shiny summer coats and several new calves have been welcomed into the herd, both strong boys, up and about and feeding well in no time at all. New Forest Eye is a problem with some of the calves, but the rest seem to have developed immunity we hope.

A sparrow hawk seems to have taken up residence in the wood, and hovers over the fields next to it. It has been lovely that the sounds of little children are once again to be heard in the wood as a woodland nursery trial continues.

In the main vegetable patch, a corner has been cleared with the help of a mini digger

and revealed a space large enough to contain a row of compost bins and a couple more beds as well! With an injection of young blood to the farm team, plans are being made to restart the vegetable box scheme. Do let us know if you might be interested!

In the house garden a large number of runner beans are almost ready to harvest, the garlic is growing well, and there are a lot of potatoes that need to be dug up before the slugs discover them! The blueberries have been replanted in a fruit cage to protect them from the birds. All they need now is some warmth and sunshine to ripen them. Don't we all!

Interestingly, around the farm, there are more saplings than usual under the oak trees after last year's bumper acorn crop. We have protected one sapling from being grazed, and would like to relocate a few others, however digging them up breaks the long tap root, weakening them – it's a dilemma.

We were very pleased at the end of last week to provide a meal made from Rush Farm beef, lamb, vegetables, and salad for a summer get together on the Business Park of all tenants and families. Everyone who was able to come brought to the gathering a real sense of this community we are all a part of here, and it was so satisfying to see people enjoying our foods – that after all is what we think and feel farming is all about!




We headed on to Abbots Morton taking our coffee break on the Green near the church.
