As autumn approaches, I hope you have all had a good summer and that many of you have taken the opportunity to use the facilities we now have on the playing field. Your Parish Council is proud to have been able to deliver improvements to the field which include the perimeter path, footpath lighting, defibrillator, picnic tables and additional benches. In addition, there has been new play equipment in the form of the timber trail and basket swing.

Recently, we have been very saddened to have had some vandalism to the new play equipment and we have also learned of instances where a small group of teenagers have been intimidating other children on the field. As well as this we are aware of other examples of anti-social behaviour that have taken place around the village, at least one of which was considered quite serious and the police have been involved.

I have lived in Lower Moor for over 33 years and in this time there have luckily been very few problems in the parish. For this reason we are determined that these recent issues are nipped in the bud. To help with this an open meeting has been arranged in the Village Hall for Monday 30th September at 7.45pm which will be attended by representatives from the police. We would encourage anyone with concerns to attend the meeting, as this will give you the opportunity to voice these and discuss with the police what action can be taken. Also if you witness any anti-social behaviour yourself we would strongly encourage you to report this directly to the police on the 101 telephone number.

Moving onto other matters, one thing we regularly get asked is who to report problems to. The sort of things raised might include offensive smells, overhanging trees, noise nuisance or even pot holes. To help with this we have included below some useful contacts for these and other things.

Finally, as the nights now draw in the next thing we have on the village calendar is the bonfire and fireworks display which this year will take place on Saturday 2nd November. We hope you will be able to attend as the team behind this have been working hard and promise a spectacular show.



Planning Applications near you

At the recent Parish Council meeting, several residents were concerned that they weren't notified about new planning applications for developments near their houses.

The local planning authority (Wychavon) usually only send letters to the immediate neighbours of any development so, even if your house is close by or opposite, you probably won't get any official notification.

In view of this, the Parish Council has decided to put up details of all new applications in the parish on the noticeboard at the corner of Cherry Orchard Road and Manor Road. Details of larger applications will still be circulated round our email mailing list.

If you have neighbours who may be interested but are less mobile than you, please let them know of any nearby planning applications too.
