Parish Precept 2020-2021

Residents will shortly be receiving from WCC notification of Council Tax for 2020/21, which will include the contribution to the Parish.

As you will remember, the Parish Council canvassed opinion in the summer of 2019 about the need to increase the precept by £4.03 for a tax band D property to cover the land purchase project that we have been working so hard on for the past 12 months.



It has always been the Parish Council's policy to keep precept increases to a minimum, and we have therefore added only a further \pounds 1.10 per tax band D household per year to the precept for maintenance of the parish, to make a total increase of \pounds 5.13. This total amounts to a little less than 10p per household per week for the year.





Spring Gardens Competition

The Parish Council wishes to celebrate the efforts people in the villages of Badsey and Aldington put into creating their spring display of garden flowers. This competition will be judged in March.

The entry can be for a front or rear garden - please ensure safe access is available. The garden can be big or small and an award will be made to the most attractive display of spring flowers. Entry forms have been available from the Spar Shop since January and entries can be made up until 15th March. The winner will be announced at the Flower Show on 25th July 2020.

There are lots of beautiful gardens around the village. Don't be shy – enter yours!

Parish Council Details and Contacts

The Council meets on the third Wednesday of every month except August at 7.30 pm in the Remembrance Hall. Rarely, circumstances may cause us to change date or venue.

Agendas are posted with three clear business days between the day of posting and the day of the meeting. Noticeboards are at Station Road, Blackminster; Round of Gras; Spar shop; Bowers Hill and Aldington. Draft minutes of meetings are posted at the Spar shop and online, final minutes of meetings are also posted, and all documents are available online at **badseypc.uk**, our website.

Councillors play an active part in other groups, such as the Remembrance Hall, the Community Club and Badsey Relief in Need Charity as well as other events in the community.

We welcome residents and every meeting begins with a Public Forum of 10 minutes during which residents may speak. Residents may be present throughout meetings but may not contribute to discussions other than during the Public Forum.

There are sub-committees for particular purposes (e.g. Planning; Events) which all report to the main Council. District and County Councillors as well as West Mercia Police are represented or send reports.
