Parish Council Meeting

The next Parish Council meeting will be held on **Wednesday 12th September at 7.45pm** in the Village Hall. Members of the public are welcome at Parish Council meetings and there is an allocated slot in which residents can bring any issues to the attention of the Parish Council.

Social Media and the Council

There have been suggestions on the Harvington Facebook that the Parish Council has large sums of money with no idea how to spend it. At the end of the last financial year the Parish Council had in **total** £105,397 in **two** accounts.

Councils have a legal power to hold revenue reserves for reasonable working capital needs and for specifically earmarked purposes. They also have to ensure that they have enough funds to cover any unexpected event. They are not allowed to go into a negative balance.

At the end of 2017-18 **the total funds remaining** of £105,397 are accounted for as such:

£89,348 held in reserve account allocated to two headings:

1. Earmarked reserves.

- a) Replace streetlight columns and lanterns.
- b) Replacement play equipment and assets.
- c) Neighbourhood Plan projects.

d) Insurance claims; contested election.

<u>2. General reserves</u> - a sum of money that is not earmarked for specific purposes but set aside to deal with unexpected events or emergencies, and to provide a working capital cushion to deal with uneven cash flows.

£16,049 remained in the current account of which £8,825 is ring fenced from grants received to maintain the Flood Alleviation scheme, Neighbourhood Plan etc. The Council agreed that the remaining £7224 would be allocated to budget headings 2018-19.

Since April 2018 £14,704 has been spent from the earmarked reserves to pay for a new bus shelter along

the Alcester Road and to replace a number of streetlights and lanterns in the Village.

Money from General Reserves will be used to meet other commitments e.g. the annual maintenance bill 2017-18 for the streetlight maintenance costs due to Worcestershire County Council once an invoice is received.

The first six months of 2018-19 running costs of £19,208 has been spent on maintenance to the Orchard, Playing Field, mowing contract, grants to local organisations, Lengthsman work, employee salary, maintenance of the planters, loan repayments on the Village Hall and much more.

The Council are looking at improving the play facilities on the playing field. It was suggested that the Council should consider equipment similar to the new play area in Salford Priors but note that the cost of their equipment was substantial with significant contribution from developers of the newly built houses.

Members of the Parish Council read every comment made on the Community Facebook page. There are frequent references to concerns raised there by villagers in the Council meetings. The Council do not use Facebook as a means of communicating back to villagers because it is not efficient in that comments are soon buried deep within the site and are easily missed. The Council are setting up a website and this should allow easy two-way communication.

New Homes Bonus

The NHB funding currently available for this year is £14,325. This funding is for our parish to use on anything which will benefit the community.

The New Homes Bonus team at Wychavon District Council are looking for substantial uses of the funding that will leave a legacy within communities. The Parish Council are currently looking into the purchase of adult gym and children's new play equipment.

Councillor's Report

County Cllr. Mr. Hopkins updated the parish council on the current issues that he is dealing with, it has been agreed that £200 will be donated from the County Divisional fund for the removal of the Oak Tree on Church Street and the Laurel bush. Mr. Hopkins also confirmed that two bollards have been installed on Village Street corner to stop vehicles from cutting the corner.

District Cllr. Mr Homer commented that he is still working to getting a PACT meeting organised, he has been in touch with the Police and will sort a date out for September.

Public Questions

A resident of Harvington raised concerns regarding an article in last months edition of the village news regarding the Crest Hill land (rear of playing field).

Parish Council Chair Dr. Davies responded by saying that the report was put into the village news as a public service after receiving correspondence from representatives of the land owners who may act against anyone found trespassing.

Another topic raised was the continuous speeding along our village streets especially Crest Hill during the early mornings and thought that maybe signage similar to the one in Norton would work. The Parish council confirmed that they are looking into possible solutions for this and are seeking advice from Highways Department and the Police, but say that if it is the same individual who are continuously breaking the speed limit for residents to take their number plate details and report it to the Safer Road Partnership:

Awards are not normally given to those under 17 years of age.

Forms for applicants who wish to be considered for an award for the academic year 2018-2019 will be available from 1st May 2018.
