I'll leave you to put your own name on it (you can probably guess what mine would be) and it is always there to be re-discovered. It never goes away, and is always waiting to be re-approached and re-imagined as though it was just beyond consciousness calling to us. And as we approach Easter that's very much the story – new life, universally available to all just waiting to be embraced, within our discernment, and only requiring a little effort from us to be engaged and delighted.

I pray that you may all have a blessed Easter and rejoice in the new life to be found in Jesus the Christ.



WALKING CLUB

Sunday 8th March - 7 of us walked nearly 5 miles, starting in Plough Road near the turning to Church Lane in Tibberton. We went down Ash Lane over the railway line, down and over Bowbrook, turning left into the old race course meadows, and then turning right into Netherwood Lane. We followed this towards Netherwood Farm, then turning right, we crossed a stile heading for Fillet Wood, in and out of the wood to Sale Green. Turning left into Pope Wood which



leads into Trench Wood, where the bluebells are beginning to peep through, but some of the primroses were in flower. We continued to an opening along the brow of the hill, where we had our refreshment stop, and down the hill to a manned level crossing, where the gates were opened for us to cross by the gate keeper. You are not allowed to cross on your own any longer. We then joined the Worcester to Birmingham canal, following this with the railway line on our left for most of the way to the edge of Tibberton village. We went left leaving the canal heading for the sewage works (land mark) and walked along behind the houses that line Plough Road, Tibberton. We passed through a flock of sheep and some ponies, before coming out into Plough Road, and turned left up the hill back to the post box where we started.

The weather was fine when we started out but soon turned to drizzle for the remainder of the walk.






April Fools' Day is celebrated every year on the first day of April. It is when people play practical jokes and hoaxes on each other. The jokes and their victims are known as "April fools". The jokes must be played before midday.

Easter is the most important festival in the Christian calendar. Jesus' Easter Sundau marks This uear Easter resurrection. Sunday is on 5th April. celebrated on the first Sunday after the first full moon after the Spring Equinox. We celebrate Easter by giving chocolate eggs. The egg is associated with new life. It is also a symbol of the resurrection of Jesus as the egg was likened to the tomb from which Christ arose.

On Saturday IIth April The Boat Race' between Oxford and Cambridge will take place. This is a four and a quarter mile race on the River Thames. This year for the first time ever The Newton Women's Boat Race will take place on the same day as the men's race and be held on the same course (the women's race has previously taken place in Henley).

Saint George's Day is the feast day of Saint George and the National Day for England. His emblem, a red cross on a white background, is the flag of England, and part of the British flag. St George was a brave Roman soldier who protested against the Romans' torture of Christians and died for his beliefs. One of the best know stories about St George is his fight with a dragon. George's emblem was adopted by Richard The Lion Heart and brought to England in the 12th century. The king's soldiers wore it on their tunics to avoid confusion in battle. It is celebrated on 23rd April which is traditionally the accepted date of Saint George's death.

The 35th London Marathon will be held on Sunday 26th April. This is a long-distance running event. The event was first run on 29th March 1981 and has been held in the spring of every year since. The marathon is run over a largely flat course around the River Thames, and spans 26 miles and 385 yards.



THOUGHT ARE WE SINNERS?

It is suggested by some that we are living in a Post Christian era. In so far as our ancestors saw that there were two periods, - pre-Christian and Christian; now, since about the 1960's, we are at a stage in history which, can legitimately be called non-Christian.



C.S.Lewis suggested this years ago. He saw that since the reformation, when Europe was a bastion of religion and orthodoxy, we were turning to a post-Christian carnality.

Mankind does not improve, even in an affluent situation. This has been proven time and time again. No more so than in America. Until mankind recognises that we are sinners, needing salvation, there is not much hope for us.

The Bible says that all have sinned. It has also told us of the means of salvationof making us right with God. The Lamb of God provided the means. Since Jesus was sacrificed on the Cross, the need for sacrificial lambs, as in the Old Testament, required by the Jewish law, was done away with.

In fact all the O.T. law was fulfilled in Christ and therefore is not obligatory for Christians today. Some still try to be justified by the principals of the law, which is impossible. Because failing in one point of the law, is equal to tailing in all the law.

(See e.g. Galatians, chapter 2, verses 15-21; 3, 10-14, and James 2,10).

To say that mankind is good at heart implies that God is a liar, and thereby bypasses the provision He has made to put things right! The Creed emphasises this. (See 1 John 1 8-10). So again I ask, are we sinners? or, more to the point are we sinners made right with God. The means have been provided, have we accepted them?

In the church calendar, we have arrived at EASTER the time when we see that God came as a man for mankind, to provide a remedy for our sins. We need to acknowledge that we are sinners, before we can accept the remedy God has provided. If we say we are not sinners we make God a liar, and the truth is not in us says the apostle John in his epistles. Cp. 1 John 8-10. (The creed also says this)
