THE STOCKS

Covering four square miles, Suckley is geographically one of the largest parishes in Worcestershire, but also one of the least populated with only around 250 residences. Seven farms utilise the greater part of the available land, producing apples, beef, cereals, hops, milk, oil seed rape, pears and potatoes. The eastern side of the Parish is part of the Malvern Hills Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty.
