Old Hills Caterpillars - Transforming our Churches

Over the last few months, we have been working behind the scenes to be ready for the start of our 2022 programme of events. We ended 2021 reporting back to both PCCs in our benefice on our observation task that took place in the autumn. We were asked 'What was it about' and 'Why turn up to a church to criticise or pass judgment?' These were hard questions to hear but very simple to answer.

Our committee has quite a simple task to do: to look at our churches now, today, and to look at their sustainability for the future. **Questions** we have to ask are: Why aren't people coming into our churches anymore? What puts them off? The welcome? The music? The format? The look of the building before they even come through the door? Too busy? How can we afford the heating? How can we afford to repair the leaking roof when only 15 people attend church once a fortnight?

We all have our own answers to those questions but, as a committee, we need to explore them in depth especially in relation to the residents in our villages: aren't they the people we want to reach out to so we can welcome and bring the church into the centre of the village life again?

Old Hills Caterpillars is purposely a group of people consisting of church members and nonchurch members, but all are parishioners of our four villages. We are all involved because we believe passionately that our **church buildings** need to be open to everyone for worship or mission, it doesn't matter. Our buildings are full of history, amazing architecture, memories from the villages that they are part of but at the same time there are fewer and fewer people coming to a church on a Sunday morning.

Which goes back to the question - why aren't people attending church?

In each church, there are books and folders showing the sterling work completed by many generations before us of the churches' role in their villages. We do not forget the past but, for the now, we have to look at today and what is happening, to ensure there is a future for our church building, congregation and a place in village life.

So we will through our events this year open our churches, be in the community and listen to what people say whilst enjoying music, food, worship, laughter and fun together!

Our first event is nearly here. We are so excited to be bringing to St Peter's Church, the Knitted Bible Exhibition from Liverpool. This is a unique opportunity to see the Bible come alive through 33 handmade knitted scenes. Over the four villages, we have rotas being filled with names for serving refreshments, welcomers, setting up the exhibition, decorating the church, making souvenirs to buy and many other roles. We are working together to bring this exhibition to you all. We already have our three local primary schools booked in to attend, which is brilliant.

If you would like to be involved in any way, please do contact me but we hope to see you all over the week to experience St Peter's Church filled with God's work.

Although this seems a huge amount of money, the plans to fully insulate the building, install a new heating system and modernise the toilets will soon take account of this full budget.

It has been great to see the hall opened up again this year. January saw a work party gather to sort out all the paraphernalia which has been gathered over the years. This gave rise to happy memories of days gone by when Guarlford was host to the summer show. There was even a list of categories for the dog shows which used to take place!

On 27th February the Village Hall Committee opened the doors to invite everyone in for tea and cake. This was a lovely opportunity

for people from the village and surrounding area to get together with friends and make new friends at the same time. Although this was mainly a social event, the Trustees were delighted that the day raised a further £350 for the regeneration fund. Thank you to everyone who came along, bought items from the craft and bric a brac tables, and made donations to the hall fund.

The Trustees continue to seek grant funding and are keen to make Guarlford Village Hall available for anyone wishing to book the hall for hire. Our year began with an excellent New Year lunch for members and partners at the Malvern Hills Hotel. It was lovely to have a room to ourselves with time to circulate after the meal.





Churches Together in Malvern (CTM) by Barbara Hill ALM (Pastoral)

CTM is composed of clergy, authorised lay minsters (ALMs), and licenced lay ministers (LLMs) from nearly every Church of the many denominations in Malvern. They come together several times a year to share news, views. activities and ideas of sharing and propagating the faith for all the churches in Malvern and surrounding areas. The chairman alternates every 4-5 years and may offer his/her place of worship as venue for the meetings. If that is not convenient at the time of the meeting, it is held in the Lyttelton rooms.

The 2014, CTM meeting was held in **Guarlford Village Hall**, when **Rev Sue Irwin** was the benefice's incumbent. A detailed talk about the history of Guarlford's church was presented before the meeting. It was the custom in previous years to introduce a little about the host church.

The first meeting of 2022 was held in **Lansdowne Methodist Church**. No one could congregate and meet during the pandemic but there were one or two meetings via Zoom for those able to access or even by telephone with other members; not quite the same as congregating together. It was the only time in history that the churches were not out and about interacting with the community. There are three representatives for the four churches of this benefice, Meg Allsop ALM (Worship) and Julia Davies LLM representing Powick and Callow End parishes and myself ALM (Pastoral) representing Guarlford & Madresfield parish.



Lyttelton Well, Great Malvern

Many years ago, when the idea of bringing all the churches together came about, it was just a small group initiated by the fledgling Lyttelton Well Christian centre in Malvern. One of Lyttelton Well's first ventures was to run an Alpha course. It was so popular that it became a bit like Topsy and grew and grew and more initiatives came about that very many associations and groups are now well established in the town. Soon, CTM came to encompass outlying village churches, such as Castlemorton, Welland, and Leigh Sinton. More recently, Upton on Severn participates, which is excellent

for all our friends with similar interests who have a practical outlook for 'Out Reach' to one's fellow man.

One of the ventures that sticks out in my mind was in Lyttelton Well's fledgling days, when Humphrey Lyttelton visited to raise funds and contributed by putting on a jazz evening at Madresfield Court. Even if one wasn't a fan of jazz, it was a very pleasant summer's evening where everyone took a picnic basket and sat beside the moat listening to music drifting across the water. Approximately four or five people from most churches in Malvern attended. It was a real boost for Lyttlelton Well, and CTM now became firmly established.

Of course, one does not need to pay a membership fee, just a desire to help in some way. All activities are organised and run by willing volunteers. Usually, the activities and concerns are pertinent to Malvern area but, when a national cry comes about, I can say most churches step up to the mark and come together. For instance, the unforeseen floods that disrupted lives and ruined properties saw many volunteers donning wet weather gear and giving their time and energies. Then there were those who joined the convoys of lorries taking aid out to Romania; those who gave temporary shelter to the homeless one particularly severe winter, when all other places were full to overflowing; the help given to Guarlford & Madresfield's 'Out Reach' to Masasi in Tanzania.

Most poignant just now is those who have personal contact with some of the visiting Boyen **Kiev Choir** members, who visited from **Ukraine** and gave such wonderful concert in Malvern Priory.

On Saturday 5th March, CTM organised a **Ukrainian Solidarity Vigil** on Belle Vue Terrace and on the following Sunday afternoon the vigil took place in



Cathedral Square Worcester. Both venues attracted scores of people, many sporting the blue and yellow colours. At the Sunday morning service in Guarlford Church, a CD of the Boyen Choir, singing their religious songs, was played and donations for Ukraine were generously given.

During the early stages of the 2020 pandemic lock down, CTM were the first to be organising themselves in delivering grocery bags to the old and vulnerable. In fact, it could be said Malvern was probably the first with the setting up of food banks, now there are collection points in every church and supermarkets throughout Malvern. In fact, Malvern has been the first in many initiative schemes with practical compassion that has quickly spread to other counties. Each Church of course initiates its own project, which is self-financing and manned by volunteers, but it is open to all to come along and help or give their particular expertise, and all are welcome to come along and receive that which may be offered. There are far too many projects to list each one individually but they can be accessed via CTM secretary sec.ctmalvern .org.uk—

CTM is very active post pandemic and eager to proceed with 'OUT REACH' to all.






