

Pauline Rosemary Jones 17th July 1935 - 17th June 2022

Pauline was born in Sutton Coldfield, the daughter of Alfred Earnest and Dorothy Eileen. Alfred was a jeweller and the young Pauline was adorned with numerous rings on her tiny fingers.

Pauline's love of horticulture came from her father, who was a keen gardener. She had an in-depth knowledge of a huge range of plants, knowing both Latin and common names, an invaluable skill in later life when she began work with Malcolm Russell at Tan House.



Pauline wrote poetry; much of her dissertation was written in Old English; she studied ballet to the age of 15years, gaining honours at grades 2 & 3 and had season tickets to the Birmingham Festival Ballet for many years.

After grammar school, Pauline graduated from University College of North Wales, Bangor, then enjoyed 15 years teaching in Derby at Homelands Girls' Grammar. Then she met her life-long friend, Sylvia, whose daughter Rachel also became a cherished friend. Pauline moved schools to Ellerslie in Malvern and taught there for 13 years until retirement in 1986, when she looked after her Mum, who died in 1989.

Pauline's life blossomed in Callow End with her church activities, Welly Club, Women's Institute, Field Club (becoming President), choir and gardening interests. The Parish Singers were a source of great joy for Pauline; she had a lovely voice, even singing a solo in *The Crucifixion*. Her circle of friends made for a busy calendar and she loved travelling to gardens in the UK - Bodnant Gardens, Kew, Hampton Court and so on.

She ended her working life at Tan House Plants with Malcolm Russell and best friend, Sue Edwards. Together, they managed the markets and won a Silver Gilt for their display at the Malvern Show.

Pauline and Sue supported the Cat's Protection League, and were devoted to the many cats in their care. The trio of friends - Pauline, Sue and Malcolm - enjoyed a happy social life with many 'away days', including canal trips and pub lunches.

Pauline was a tremendous support in Malc's final month's and gradually she became part of the Russell family. When life became more difficult, Mary, her carer, Anne her gardener and Percy her handyman were a great support.

Eventually she moved to Welland where she was well cared for, enjoyed her cooked breakfast each day and shared a happy life with her new family.

She enjoyed pride of place in the corner of the lounge, surrounded by her books, papers, drawing materials and chocolates, befitting a woman of her culture and dignity.

She passed away, peacefully, in her sleep on Friday 17th June; a big thank you to all the Welland staff for their warmth and patience.

These are extracts from the eulogy written and read at Pauline's funeral on 13th July 2022 by David Russell, her friend for 30years.

The range apparently is -5 to 34 degrees; anything outside this is considered unusual. I agree; anything outside that is too weird for me.

As the grass recovers and the plants improve in the rain, and there is no longer a need to water, they certainly seem to be thriving more. **Super Trooper**, my orange rose, is as usual going great guns despite the odd weather we have been having. My newest rose, **Lady**

Marmalade, is also doing well and is a lovely colour.

Recently, I was on the other side of the Newland island, at the garage there, and I took this photo (right). When you see the Beauchamp from a different angle, you realise why strangers sometimes struggle to find us. It does not help that Google maps directs you to Pinder Court instead of to the Beauchamp.

I am sorry that this is the last edition of *The Grapevine*. My hopes of further editions have not been realised. Many voluntary organisations are struggling, as fewer people are willing to volunteer to do things and I fear many, many more voluntary or charitable organisations will close due to lack of help. I have already heard of two such that will be shutting down or have already closed due to a lack people willing to help.

I am not sure if this is due to a 'not me' attitude or a genuine lack of interest or that the retirement age has been raised and that the newly retired are needed more by their family and do not have the time to commit to helping others.






