Production of the PC newsletter- It was agreed that a newsletter will be prepared for delivery at beginning of December with majority of councillors being able to deliver them. This will be delivered with Christmas card. b. ID will check that company are able to produce card, AT will provide a photo if school are unable to carry out Christmas drawing competition for winning entry to be the cover of card. c. Action required relating to set-up of Neighbourhood Watch-It was agreed to ask again in Community News and newsletter for interested residents with a view to arranging some kind of meeting for January 2021 to get the scheme up and running. d. The installation of cctv cameras at village play areas in response to vandalism as well as the securing of benches at Badsey rec was considered. It was agreed to defer the installation of cctv as issues appeared to have resolved but to re-assess in March 2021. - Wychavon have now approved the Geo-Physical Survey details provided by the professional company and PC has requested that they proceed. Date has not yet been confirmed but site needs to be clear of livestock and mown. Clerk has been in contact with the ex-tenant of the Diocese and they have discussed and amicably agreed timescales for the site to be vacated and made good.
- Comments/observations and questions raised by a resident were considered, extensive discussion took place regarding this matter. Some of the questions should now have been answered in the land update on the agenda. Other points raised are available in previous minutes. Many of the points are regarding matters and discussions that have not yet taken place and thus no answers have been considered and decided at this time. They will be minuted and published at a future point in the required way. A number of the requests/comments are regarding PC procedures and cannot be fulfilled or changed. A vote was taken by councillors on the content to be provided in the minutes and to the resident concerned with 12 votes in favour and 1 abstention to proceed in this way.
- Discussion took place regarding the provision of the skip in Aldington and whether this could be considered at Bowers Hill. The arrangement is a longstanding historical arrangement and not a precedent. It is in recognition of the village organised litter picks within Aldington where all 100 houses are involved and in return as well as gathering rubbish, household rubbish can be disposed of. The ARA liaise with Wychavon and arrange the equipment and confirm all of the details with the PC. In order to consider a request for a similar arrangement within the parish, groups would need to submit a timetable of litter picks planned together with volunteers confirmed, the proposed location of the skip and the safety of the location assessed so that the PC could consider the details at a future PC meeting.

A site visit is required to determine the correct distance. In the application 17/01958 Highways had the house moved 2 metres further back this would be the same in this instance. If this application is approved, the number of potential car parked for 5 houses would not be inkeeping with the character of Badsey Fields Lane, the entire</p>

frontage would be dropped kerb meaning that roadside parking would not be possible for a large stretch on the road.

The connection to the sewer has not been addressed, Large chambers were installed in the storm drain at the points where foul sewer pipes emerged from each house on the south side of the lane so that the sewer pipes could run through the chambers and into the main sewer beyond, while the rainwater flowed around the sewage pipes and on to the next chamber.

The reduction of light to no. 12 has not been addressed from the original application, a site visit is required to establish this.

There are a number of points raised here which require a site visit before any decision can be considered on this application.

Request for crossing on Bretforton Road near Hither Green has been received as residents from new developments have to cross the road at other end of B4035 to crossing. This is a particularly hazardous part of the village with HGV's turning from Birmingham Road and the 'S bend' so residents have to navigate crossing over B4035 on 2 occasions as well as Birmingham Road in order to get to village centre and school. Clerk has visited location and watched first hand as people chance running over the road in a gap in the traffic. The other crossing is outside Badsey Remembrance Hall but is too far away and takes them out of their way to their destination.
