214. County/District Councillor Reports

County Cllr Ian Hardiman's Report

Lea Lane Landslip:

As reported in March, negotiations between the County Council and other parties have still not yet been resolved and therefore the necessary works have not commenced.

Lea Castle Quarry Application (19/00053/CM): The County Council's Development manager has not yet announced when the County Council's Planning Committee will consider the application.

Cookley Castle Road Trees: The dead tree by property number 71 has been removed; The roots of a tree by number 41 which have been causing damage to the property is also to be removed in the near future.

Wolverley Trees Safety: I have referred the issue of dead and unsafe trees present in the large verge by the junction of Blakeshall Lane and the B4189 to Highways who have agreed to investigate as they are on County owned land.

District Councillors Report

Local Issues

We have been dealing with the usual routine casework, reporting litter and fly tipping on the main A roads and along the country lanes.

We have been keeping a keen eye on planning and enforcement issues across the Parish as usual of which there are a number! The shack at the Lock has nearly been completed to WFDC's satisfaction, just the pink door to be done now and signage to be checked.

WFDC continue to monitor the issues regarding the Motor X.

Wyre Forest Issues

Wyre Forest House is still closed to the public as is the Green Street hub save for dealing with housing and homelessness applications. Staff continue to work from home.

The Council led by the Progressive Alliance continues to pursue a localism agenda, divesting itself of many local services and assets. It is in talks with all 3 towns regarding the transfer of land, buildings, parks and open spaces, toilets and the potential TUPE of staff etc.... This also has ramifications for Wolverley and Cookley Parish Council as the Progressive Alliance are proposing to remove grants for litter picking and bin emptying and grass cutting over time and expect the Parish Council to precept for it.

All meetings are still being held virtually and there will be a special council meeting on 21st April to agree the arrangements for remote meetings until the Government legislate accordingly.

There are significant staff shortages at Green Street at present as a result of Covid-19 which is severely affecting bin collection and litter picking on A-roads.

Cllr. C Sherrey advised of unacceptable excessive noise from a Moto x practice event that took place a on hot day last week when the children were in school and asked for WFDC to be made aware of this. Cllr. L Jones will advise Worcester Regulatory Services, WFDC Enforcement and copy the Clerk.

215. <u>Financial Matters.</u>

- a) Annual Accounts Year ended 31st March 2021.
 Clerk advised details for year end have been received from external auditor PKF Littlejohn. Deadline for return 2nd July 2021. Wolverley & Cookley have been randomly selected for an Intermediate Audit rather than Basic so will have slightly more information to provide. The Accounts will be submitted for approval at the June meeting.
- b) To discuss street lighting invoices 2017/18 & 2018/19.

 Cllr. C Sherrey advised that although still not convinced that the Council has seen the cost savings promised by converting to LEDs the latest bill has seen a reduction of nearly £500 and proposes that the invoices should be paid. This was agreed. There are still discrepancies with the Parish lighting initiative statement as WCC are charging maintenance on less columns.
- c) To agree the schedule of cheques to be signed. Unanimously Agreed.

216. To agree way forward with consulting community regarding Lea Lane.

The Chairman advised that at the last meeting it was agreed to consult the communities on the decision whether Lea Lane remain full vehicular access or be changed to an active travel route and invited Councillors to agree the way forward. Cllr. D Jones who made the proposal suggested that it would not be practical to rush into a referendum/consultation which may be quite costly until agreement has been reached by all parties and the road re-opened. Discussion ensued and Cllr. D Jones proposed to defer the agreed consultation with the community until the road has been restored. This was carried with 7 for, 4 against and 1 abstain.

217. To discuss forthcoming meetings following government announcement on virtual meetings.

Clerk advised that virtual meetings will not be allowed after May 6^{th} . After much discussion it was agreed that the next meeting scheduled for May 4^{th} be held via Zoom and then future meetings will resume face to face, alternating between Wolverley Church Hall and Cookley School.
