JOINED UP ENTERTAINMENTS

The 10th annual Summer Fete was fabulous. Possibly the best so far. The sun shone, but not too brightly, the teams all worked really hard to set it all up and then run the various stalls and the people came.

We started setting up around 9.30am and finished clearing up by about 6.30.

During the Fete, between 2-5pm we had games, stalls, cakes, ponies, reptiles and raccoons and the old fashioned Penny Arcade. We had Chips, Pimms and Cream Teas. We had Boat Trips. In the central arena surrounded by straw bales we had a dog show – Waggiest Tail and Most like their Owner. Later we had children's races including egg and spoon race, three legged race, sack race and more. Throughout the afternoon we had Wyre Piddlers performing under the pointy tent including the entire Meusz family including Eve, Nino, Tash and Sofia who entertained us with covers as well as their own music.
