d) **Minutes**: Minutes of the November 2019 Council meeting were approved as true and accurate. Proposed by JP and seconded by DW

#### e) County Councillors' report:

- Cllr Adams asked that before meeting with BWB consultants regarding flooding alleviation plans that a
  meeting is arranged before 5<sup>th</sup> Feb with Barry Barnes, Mark Morris and the flooding group to establish
  what works are already planned by the County Council for Peopleton on the south side
- Still works outstanding in the middle of the village where Severn Trent damaged a pipe and also by Mrs Hodgetts house where there is an issue with a gully
- County council are struggling with flooding issues across the county currently
- The railings at Wassells corners are planned to be straightened asap
- Working on a notice of motion to help Clerks manage overgrown hedges across paths- whereby a template letter to landowners can be signed and sent out by Clerks rather than waiting for Councils
- Will highlight the possibility of a white line in the middle of the road by Lockwoods to Barry Barnes on his next visit to Peopleton
- Following the meeting with Alan Amos regarding reducing the speed limit on the A44 a report is due out shortly with recommendations to follow

### **District Councillors' Report:**

#### g) Progress reports:

- a) Chairmans report
  - Chair, Clerk and Cllr Baxter met in December to discuss the precept and parish budget for 2020-2021 which was productive and thanks to Cllr Baxter for his input which was very helpful
  - Attended the Calc area meeting on 5<sup>th</sup> December which was an open forum discussing parking wardens in rural areas, precepts and the role of the lengthsman and difficulty of seeking contractors for small jobs. Discussed how 30% of Clerks are qualified in the County and how the Chair would like the parish council to support future training for the Clerk to gain such a qualification.
  - There is a garden party at Buckingham Palace on 19<sup>th</sup> May and NALC are seeking nominations for those who have served councils/ parishes/ Mayors in the past and who meet the criteria. Welcomed suggestions of anyone to nominate

• Finalising the plans for the new play area with work set to start in the next 6-7 weeks and there will be an official opening with a bbq

- Turkey sales went well over Christmas

  - Nothing to report
- f) Footpaths
  - Bridle path from Wassells corner to Pinvin Rd has been cleared by a walking party Minutes Jan 2020

- g) Highways & Byways issues
  - Hardcore is needed in Green Lane and access needs restricting as 4x4 vehicles are driving up it and causing extensive damage- Cllr Adams to ask Barry Barnes for advice
  - Bollards on Wassells corner are still required -to be addressed with Barry Barnes
  - Some manhole covers are sinking slightly which may need looking at
- h) New Residents' welcome pack
  - All completed
- i) Flooding
  - Existing flood alleviation scheme in the village is so far working well
  - There is a meeting with BNB consultant Stuart Nelmes on Wednesday 5<sup>th</sup> February to discuss what can be possibly done on the south side of the village
  - Planned works for January in Peopleton as promised by Martyn Cross to clear the watercourse bed and trim back overgrown hedges to facilitate this are still to be started. Cllr Robinson warned that there may be a delay due to more urgent flooding in the district taking priority
