		A very good turnout for the Violettes on Saturday 12 th October 2019. The history evening and				
		renaming of the bar to "The Squire's Bar" was a very interesting evening. 2 Christmas events are due				
		to take place in December one for the children of the parish and an evening event for adults.				
	b)	<u>Footpaths</u>				
		A resident contacted the PC regarding hard core that had been dropped alongside a path close to his				
		property. Chair Boss & Cllr Spence visited the site and agreed that the hard core was not				
		environmentally friendly. The resident has asked the Environmental department to visit the site.

		Cllr Cheape has some issues as to where some of the trees should be planted and would appreciate any				
		thoughts on where they could go.

		In her absence Cllr Teague had advised that requests had been received from New Starts – an initiative				
		to house homeless people whilst coming off abusive substances – this request had been approved. A				
		request for funding had been approved for talking therapies only for people in the Batchley area who				
		have or are suffering from mental health issues. 2 other requests had been refused as they did not

5.	Lengthsman		
	Lengthsman Chris Cooke was in attendance. A resident had raised an issue with flooding by his property.		
	This issue has been occurring for a couple of years with Highways and the Water Management people		
	visiting the site. In reality the ditches need to be dug out but due to public risk, the road needs to be closed		
	to traffic for this work to take place. Mr Cooke has asked Richard Clewer of Highways if this could be		
	arranged but has had no response – the Clerk will contact WCC Cllr Kit Taylor to ask if he can bring pressure		
	on Highways department to get the road closed in order that the work can take place.		
	Due to the severe flooding in the last week the Lengthsman has been working alongside Highways at nigh		
	to try and clear gullies – whilst the work of the contractors once they attended multiple sites was good, th		
	organisation by Highways department of such work was appalling to the extent that in some cases the		
	contractors arrived at sites with no night lights etc and if the Lengthsman had not been in attendance they		
	would not have had sufficient light / equipment to carry out the necessary work.		
6.	CALC		
	The Bromsgrove Area CALC meeting is due to take place on the 11 th December 2019. Susan Satchell had		
	asked if any PCs would like to talk about how they had tackled any challenging planning proposals that		
	occurred within their Parish. Cllrs Spence & Vice Chair Bewsher kindly agreed to talk to the meeting about		
	the issues Bentley has had with the Foxlydiate development.		
7.	Risk assessment		
	Following the recommendation of the external Auditor last year, the Clerk has collated a "Risk Assessment"		
	document for the PC to review. This was agreed as being correct and signed by the Chair.		
8.	Bentley Bugle 2020		
	Vice Chair Bewsher and the Clerk have had the first meeting with regard to next year's issue. Any		
	suggestions for articles would be greatly appreciated. Articles need to be completed by mid December. Cllr		
	Spence has already drafted 2 articles for publication – one covering the "lanes are our lives" project and an		
	update from FTWP on the work they have been doing.		
9.	Superfast Fibre		
	Yet again the "go live" dates that WCC gave for the cabinet covering Angel Street and Manor Road have		
	been missed! Only this week has Pump House Lane been closed to traffic in order that BT can put the		
	ducting in so it was impossible that a September 2019 date could ever have been achieved.		
	Cllr Meads had written to Right Hon Sajid Javid MP again to ask if he would write to Clive Selly on our behalf		
	to find out what is happening with rural broadband but the response was somewhat inconclusive.		
	Airband have not responded with regard to the possibility of them providing a broadband service to the		
	Parish – Vice Chair Bewsher believes this is because when they looked at what is needed for Bentley, the		
	cost is prohibitive.		
	The Clerk had contacted County Councillor Kit Taylor who said he would raise the issue of Broadband speed		
	within the Parish at a meeting he was having on the 17 th July 2019, to ask what the outcome of that meeting
