#### 6 PLANNING MATTERS:

#### Applications for Consideration:

13/0659 Extension of time for permission: 3 Tutnall Grange: conversion of storage space above garage into habitable accommodation and addition of dormer window to rear. Planning approval B/2007/1256 and 10/0682. **It was resolved** there was no comment to make to the application.

#### **Planning Matters:**

13/0727 2 The Woodlands, Hewell Lane: Certificate Existing Lawful Use/Dev for single storey permanent residential dwelling.

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2013/0179/ENF Land at Wharf Lane: Field approx. half way down with a sign outside 'Wharfe Paddock'. About half a dozen buildings have been erected, one of which is allegedly being lived in. Noted.

- 7 **REINSTATEMENT OF COBLEY HILL WINDMILL:** As no restoration work had been started, Members agreed that the Chairman would ask for the gear box to be returned.
- 8 **RAILINGS TO THE PLYMOUTH MEMORIAL:** Cllr Wheeler-Vine showed Members the fence prototype. As a courtesy gesture it was agreed that the Clerk would contact the Conservation Officer to advise that the fencing was being replaced with like-for-like seasoned oak.
- 9 **LENGTHSMAN SCHEME:** Brockhill Lane ditchwork near Brockhill Farm had not been carried out; Lengthsman to be reminded.

## 10 HIGHWAYS MATTERS:

Himalayan Balsam: Highways did not have a policy for its eradication. The weed was growing on the corner of Wharf Lane and Stoney Lane, ditch side of the animal sanctuary. Hewell Lane gabions: should be finished shortly. Pikes Pool Lane: road closure for four days from 11 November for Severn Trent.

- 11 **COMMUNITY HALL CAR PARK ENTRANCE RESURFACING**: Patching work to the road entrance is still being discussed.
- 12 BACKING-UP PC DOCUMENTS USING THE CLOUD: Deferred to the next meeting.
- 13 INSURANCE RISK: LIBEL & SLANDER COVER: Noted
- 14 ORCHARD MAINTENANCE: Both plots had been seeded with the wild flower mix. The suggestion of putting up flower meadow signs would discussed at the next meeting. A letter had been received from the bowling club, giving permission for the tops of the trees to be cut back to six feet only.
- 15 DOLAN PARK HOSPITAL DISCHARGE: The Environment Agency had confirmed that formal samples taken from the ditch had come back as passes. It was agreed a letter be sent to the EA asking:
  - why no prosecutions have taken place given that this was not the first time a serious pollution had occurred at the site and,
  - why Dolan Park had been given five months to get the discharge down to an acceptable level of pollution.
- **16 BROAD GREEN FLOWER BED:** No further correspondence had been received and Members noted the roses were still looking good.
- 17 NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN: Given the rural nature of the parish, it was agreed it was not feasible to produce a Plan.
- 18 COUNCILLOR TRAINING ON THE GENERAL POWER OF COMPETENCE: Members agreed it was unlikely the Council would use these powers so training was not needed.
- **19 NEWSLETTER:** Members to be asked to provide photos of rural scenes so a decision could be made for the front cover.
