# 4. Approval of the Minutes of the Previous Meeting

# 5. Chairman's Report

- 5.1 Bus shelters the insides have been protected with a rubber coating / paint to prevent further deterioration.
- 5.2 Fly tipping the chair thanked the Lengthsman and his team who recently cut back vegetation in a hot spot to stop vehicles "hiding" whilst off loading their rubbish. 10 nitrous oxide cylinders were found in a grit bin. Fly tipping is the biggest crim in the area. JG has created a program for monitoring tips within the Parish.
- 5.3 Speeding JG went out with the Safety Team. On Church Hill Lane 21 cars averaged 28 miles per hour. JG is looking to put together a voluntary community speed check team within the area 6 volunteers are required.
- 5.4 Crossroads the lines have been painted in the wrong location. Works to rectify will be carried out within 2/3 weeks.
- 5.5 Tractor signs there is one in the hedge in Illey Lane. The Inspector is to site more in the area.
- 5.5 Sewer £72,000 has been allocated by the Council towards the sewer. KM will provide an update at the next meeting, after all parties have met with discuss same. The delay is unacceptable.
- 5.6 Speed watch has been cancelled until further notice.

#### 6. Finance

- 6.1 The bank statement and reconciliation spreadsheet were reviewed by all Councillors.
- 6.2 £975 has been spent out of £2000 allocated to the Lengthsman.

#### 7. Planning Matters

Housing targets have increased from 386 to 704.

Eight Hills – the National Trust are talking to BDC with an aim to establish green space equality. The project is worth £9 million to BDC.
