This would probably not be approvable by WCC as highways authority although walking should be encouraged. egard to parking MD commented that the NDP procedure could not be relied for solving all problems within the community. Four main topics were identified – ig, doctor's surgery, school (both have pressure for places and insufficient ity to expand) and environmental appearance. It was suggested that we could out an audit of the high street and identify the parts that are not liked then lobby provements; such actions need to be tempered with realistic/realisable aims. bove issues could possibly be solved via the Green Belt review, but would this en as an acceptable way forward? egard to the issue of identifying specific sites for future development, it was sted that the landowner's agreement is not required as long as the landowner is do fit he intention to ask the question. Respondents could be asked to prioritise although when putting maps and plans together MD advised 'vague is best'. A approach might be to highlight back to residents the big issues, eg parking, I capacity, doctors' capacity and say that the only way to make progress is if je takes place. So, a housing scheme may trigger an extra classroom but the ity is framing the question to rea
