# 3. Adoption of the Minutes of the previous meeting

# 5. Reports from District and County Councillors

District Councillor Bronwen Behan reported that

- she had raised the matter of the Parish Council receiving paper, as opposed to electronic, copies of planning application with the Planning Officer but had not received the reply the Council hoped for;
- the Planning Officer was intending to hold a training session for parish councillors on permitted development;
- MHDC had recently lost a significant number of planning appeals and was therefore likely to be put into special measures with respect to large developments. The fundamental cause lay in MHDC's not having adopted the necessary underlying policies.

## **<u>6. Reports from Police</u>**

Pc Naulls reported that

- the policy 'surgery' by the school had had to be abandoned because of the heavy rains; it would however be re-scheduled for an appropriate time within the next month or so;
- the recent spate of thefts of catalytic converters appeared to be abating;
- residents should be aware of thefts of credit cards and PINs by deception: never give your PIN to anyone over the phone.

Councillors noted their continuing displeasure at receiving electronic and not paper copies of planning applications and instructed the Clerk to make appropriate representations to the MHDC Planning Officer, the Portfolio Holder, the Monitoring Officer and CALC.

#### Council's comments

Our concern regarding this proposal to bring forward the site opening time focuses totally on the impact to the approach road infrastructure.

Opening from 8.00 am would clash with both school and work traffic on an already busy stretch of road.

The impact of this clash can only be evaluated by traffic census monitoring, capturing volume and spread.

We request that the Highways dept conduct a thorough review and furnish the planning officer with their findings and recommendations

Note: As we approach the Christmas shutdown it is vital that any Highway initiative captures 'normal' routine activity.

#### 9. Drainage

Councillors were unaware of any houses within the parish flooded during the recent adverse weather and attributed this good result to the greater attention which had been paid to the maintenance of ditches.

#### **10. BT Phone Boxes**

The Clerk reported that BT had now disconnected the electricity supply to the box at Wad Lane. Councillors discussed the future of that box and decided that the Chairman should propose to the School that the School buy it for £1 on condition that they removed it from the existing site.

#### **<u>11. Application for Rural Rate relief</u>**

Councillors discussed the application and noted that the business emphasis of the pub had changed from being local in nature to regional; it was however thought that this should not necessarily be decisive in the Council's consideration of the application. It was agreed that the pub was of benefit to the community, although the nature and scale of that benefit was less clear. Council was also mindful of other businesses within the parish to which the advantages of rural rate relief were not available.

Accordingly Council took the view that the business, even though apparently very successful, should be encouraged and it was therefore <u>**RESOLVED**</u> that the Council recommend to **MHDC that Option B be adopted.** 

Councillors noted the comments made in the application about the views allegedly held by the Council and did not recognise them as a fair statement.
