# MADRESFIELD PARISH COUNCIL MINUTES OF THE 187<sup>th</sup> PARISH COUNCIL MEETING HELD AT ST MARY CHURCH MADRESFIELD ON THURSDAY 4<sup>TH</sup> SEPTEMBER 2014 AT 7.00PM.

#### 1. APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE

To consider acceptance of apologies for absence from Councillors: There were none.

#### 2. INTERESTS

# 3. APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES OF THE ANNUAL AND 186<sup>th</sup> PARISH COUNCIL MEETING OF $8^{TH}$ MAY

These were accepted as an accurate record and they were signed by the Chairman.

### 4. PROGRESS REPORTS AND OTHER MATTERS ARISING FROM THESE MINUTES

It was noted that the VAS was in the village again and would be at various positions for one month out of every four.

### 5. REPORTS FROM DISTRICT AND COUNTY COUNCILLORS

There were none.

# 6. REPORTS FROM WARDENS AND OTHER REPRESENTATIVES

- i. **Tree Warden:** Cllr. Craig reported that there was no sign of ash die back near Worcestershire although the position was being closely monitored.
- **ii. Footpath Warden:** Cllr. Baldwin confirmed that he was more mobile now following an injury and had been able to walk most of the paths. A bridge had been replaced over Madresfield brook on the path towards the Old Hills.
- iii. Charities Representative: A report would be made following the next meeting of the charities.

# 7. HIGHWAYS

**Update on progress with speed limits and passing bays:** The Clerk reported that the speed limit review for North End Lane was now under way and he would forward the results to councillors. Unfortunately the request for a passing bay on Rectory Lane had been refused since WCC would require that it be made to a full specification with tarmac, curbing and drainage. No funding was available for such a project. Originally the Parish Council had hoped that it could be of a simple hard core construction and the Clerk was to ask if there were any other options available. It was noted that a speed enforcement team had visited the village recently and the Clerk was to thank the Safer Roads Partnership.

# 8. NEIGHBOURHOOD PLANNING

**Update:** No news had been received from Newland Parish Council. However Cllr. Eden agreed to write a report for the Grapevine magazine asking residents to forward their opinions on development and also ask for comments on the future of the phone box by the primary school.

# 9. PLANNING

#### The following application was considered:

Application No.	From	Details
14/00788/OUT		Outline application for residential development of up to 59 dwellings. All matters reserved with the exception of access.

Although the proposed development did not lie within Madresfield its effect would be considerable and the following response was agreed:

The Parish Council is concerned over the effect the development will have on traffic in the local area, particularly the section of North End Lane through Madresfield and we have several requests. 1. We would strongly advise that access to the site should be considered from Mayfield Grove. An access road leading directly to the edge of the site is already in place and direct access onto the major section of North End Lane would be far preferable to the chaotic proposed arrangements for access via Mayfield Road.

2. If Mayfield Road access is allowed there will be an increase in traffic on the section of North End Lane through Madresfield with traffic avoiding the Newland roundabout area. North End Lane is single track for a proportion of its length and was not designed to even take the flow of traffic that it currently does. Any unnecessary extra vehicle movements could be discouraged by making this section of North End Lane 'access only'.

3. If Mayfield Road access is allowed we would also advise that a mini roundabout be installed at the Townsend Way/Mayfield Road junction to ease traffic flow.
