

# Welland Neighbourhood Plan A local plan- By local People – For local Peopl



The Localism Act provides a new statutory regime for neighbourhood planning.

Neighbourhood planning enables communities to shape the development and growth of their local area through the production of a Neighbourhood Plan

 The aim of these sessions is to provide you with information about what a neighbourhood plan is, to find out if you think Welland should develop one, what you think the important issues are and how you can get involved

#### Where did the idea come from?

- Major changes to the Planning System (Localism Act 2011)
- Empowering local people to shape their village's future
- Your local Parish Council and a group of volunteers taking the initiative

#### What does this mean for Welland?

- A plan that will shape how the parish changes
- An opportunity for community views to carry more weight in planning decisions and community services
- An opportunity for the community to receive 25% of any revenues from Community Infrastructure Levy arising from development
- An opportunity for community views to mean something

#### What would the plan cover?

- All, or some of the following:
  - Future housing, recreation, employment, our local environment and community services
- Covering a period through until 2030
  - Will complement the South Worcestershire Development
     Plan
- Once approved, the plan be the blueprint for how our village evolves

#### How would the plan be produced?

- A steering group commissioned by the Parish Council leads the process
- Its aim is to engaged the community
- Community views determine the scope, objectives and priorities for the Welland Plan
- Volunteers from the community helped by outside bodies will draft ad edit the plan
- The aim is to complete the plan by spring 2015
- The community must approve it by referendum
- The Planning Inspectorate must approve it

#### Some Themes to consider?

- Improving Community Services
- Housing needs
- Jobs and the local economy
- Encouraging a thriving Community
- Protecting our environment

#### What would it cost?

- Neighbourhood plans have no fixed costs nor fixed template
- The cost will depend on the scope of the Welland plan and how much external resource is needed
  - similar size communities expect costs to develop their neighbourhood plan to be in the region of £20-25,000.
  - costs to consider include: public engagement and consultation, websites, printing, technical support
- Opportunity to learn from other communities ahead of us in the process
- Funding is available from national government, local councils and outside bodies
