The private property 'keep out signs' on land at Crest Hill have recently been removed by persons unknown and have been reported to the police with photographic evidence.

The owners of the site have replaced them, the Council would like to remind everyone that the area is private property.

The owners have said they will be visiting the land on a regular basis and that trespassers will be reported to the Police with photographic evidence if caught on site.

# Perkins' Educational Foundation Awards for the Academic Year 2018-2019

The Governors of this charity, founded in 1656 by William Perkins of Salford Priors and London, invite applications for awards from young people under the age of 25. Grants are available to help with expenses in courses of study in further and higher education, vocational training such as apprenticeships, and in some circumstances, structured programmes of personal development such as overseas visits. Awards are not normally given to those under 17 years of age. Applicants must have been resident in one of the following parishes - Salford Priors, Bidford, Kings Broom, Cleeve Prior or Harvington -for not less than two years immediately prior to their application. Application forms are available, upon written request, from the Clerk to the Governors, info@williamperkinscharity.org.

Forms for applicants who wish to be considered for an award for the academic year 2018-2019 will be available from 1st May 2018. Completed forms should be returned to the Clerk not later than 15th October 2018. Applicants may be required to attend before the Governors for an interview at a time and place to be notified in due course by the Clerk.

## **Community Transport**

Are you having difficulty getting to the Alexandra or Worcester Hospitals for appointments?

There is now a pilot scheme called Community Transport Connections, which can help patients who are eligible because of mobility limitations or who have no other means of transport available.

For more information or to register for this service, you will need to call 0300 3239965, Mon-Fri 9am-4pm.

Once registered, you will be able to use this service, provided by Volunteer drivers in cars. There is a charge for each journey.

The scheme covers all rural and urban areas in Evesham, Pershore, Worcester, Droitwich and Redditch.

Community Transport to hospitals wider afield (i.e. Birmingham) is also available (often much cheaper than a taxi) and transport to GP and Dental appointments, shops, visiting friend and relatives is also provided. Again, there is a charge for each journey.

## **Neighbourhood Watch**

Protect your home while on holiday. We all look forward to going on holiday but want to make sure that while we are away that our homes are safe from intruders.

While you are packing your suitcase remember to take a few precautions to reduce the chances of your property becoming a target for burglars as much as possible.

Ask a neighbour that you trust to look after your property when you are away by drawing the curtains, turning lights on/off, picking up post etc. Ask a neighbour to park a car on your drive. Cancel all milk and papers.

Ask a neighbour to make sure wheelie bins are not left out on pavement for any length of time this is a dead giveaway that there is no one home. Restrict access to the rear of your property.

Approximately 90% off all domestic burglary is targeted from the rear. Restrict access by locking side gates and make sure all outside lighting is in good order.

Lock away garden tools and equipment. Many opportunist crimes are committed by using tools or hard implements such as stones found in the garden, garage or shed.

By taking a few small measures, you can reduce your risk of becoming a victim.


