1. Apologies For Absence.

Apologies were received and accepted from Cllrs Mr Richard Coghlan and Mr Andrew Rhodes.

2. Declaration Of Interests.

Cllr's were reminded to update their Register of Interests with Wychavon.

Cllr Rowland-Hill had made enquiries regarding keep fit equipment for the playing field. The council agreed for contact to be made with Malcolm Dunn, BCPR, and organisations that supply suitable equipment.

- The council is concerned at the three day event that took place at Croft Farm over the weekend of 4, 5, 6 September. Unlike previously Croft Farm has not liaised with the parish council regarding noise levels. The council agreed for Cllrs Hardman and Handy to visit Croft Farm.
- The council is happy for the 'coach to 5K 'to continue on the playing field.
- Tree inspection is ongoing, clerk to chase Mr Onions. It was noted that a large tree on the verge between St Giles Road and Main Road was dying and should be removed.
- The council agreed for residents in Blenheim Drive to cut back the trees to stop them interfering with the phone lines.
- The dead tree in Brasenose Road will hopefully be removed by Highways.
- Clerk to follow up on the TPO for the orchard in Eckington Road.
- The council agreed not to apply for a Flood Grant as it could not meet the criteria.

 W/94/01594 but without compliance with condition 6 (so to allow occupation without connection to manor house). The Parish Council objects to the proposal
 - iv. W/15/01763/PN Laurel Park, Kemerton Road. The Parish Council objects to the proposal. Cllr Darby did not object to the proposal. Cllrs Handy and Sly abstained.
 - w. W/15/02008/PP 47 Hill Close, Westmancote, Bredon. Removal of existing rear conservatory and lean-to entrance canopy and erection of rear and side single-storey extension and 1st floor dormer roof extension.
 The Parish council is not aware of any strong planning policy grounds for objecting to the proposal. This response is a general observation and should not be taken as objecting to or supporting the application.
 - vi. W/15/02111/PN Steepholm, Dock Lane, Bredon, Tewkesbury. Proposed Replacement Dwelling. The Parish council is not aware of any strong planning policy grounds for objecting to the proposal, provided a Cotswold stone facing is used instead of 'natural stone'. This is to preserve and enhance the Conservation Area immediately over the road. This response is a general observation and should not be taken as objecting to or supporting the application.
